SPRING FIELD DAY 2005

n Saturday November 12th the Club Station VK3SOL was set up at Mt Gwynne about 10 Km west of Mulwala on the VK2 side of the border . Five S A D A R C members attended, Ross VK3UCR, Mark VK3HMB, George VK3HV, Ed VK3BG & Max SWL and also a couple of visitors.

The station was quickly assembled and on air within an hour of arriving and contesting began. Propagation Charts showed a big black hole over South east Australia this was confirmed by lack of signals from the southern part of the state.

However conditions north of the

Dividing Range were a bit better resulting in contacts from near the VK3/VK5 border to Canberra and mountains near Cooma.

Apart from George and myself none of the other operators had any contesting or field day experience, so they were encouraged to do most of the talking to gain knowledge.

While there were only 34 contacts on 4 bands the most distant contacts were made on 432Mhz and 1296 Mhz with signals reaching 59 on occasions.

The equipment used was Kenwood TS-570S on 6m, Kenwood TS-790A on 2m & 23cm, plus a Kenwood TS-811A on 70 cm with output power of 100 watts PEP ON 6/2/70 AND 10 watts PEP on 23 cm.

Antennas used were half wave vertical on 6 m, 8 EL yagi on 2 m, 48 EL J Beam on 70 cm, 45 EL loop yagi on 23 cm , all fed with low loss Heliax cable. A 750 Watt Generator and a 40A Switch Mode Power supply kept the juice flowing. We packed up just after 7 pm and were all on way home before dark.

We all enjoyed the day and will be ready to do it again on Saturday January the 15th — 16TH 2006 for the Summer Field Days operating from Mt Wombat.

They have a built-in power supply, battery backup and charge facilities, along with plenty of room to make modifications like installing Repeater Controller Boards etc."

The new Antenna

Polar 6db Colinear Gain Antenna has been ordered having a supposed 0.75 db gain over the old Phelps Dodge ant. It is around 7.5 meters in length as opposed to the old ant of 6.1 meters in length. The angle of radiation (beam width) is 3 degrees smaller than the old PD making it 15deg. This is said to be the main contributing factor of gain in a colinear antenna. Like the PD antenna, there is no added down-tilt built into the design. The quoted cost of this antenna at trade price is \$990.00 plus GST and has been ordered. Other sundry costs (crimp plugs, mast finalised. If fittings etc) have not as yet been all well, here goes the antenna might be within couple of weeks.

The Foundation Licence Manual and the 2006 Callbook is in the hands of our Assessor. For those who ordered the callbook they will be at the BBQ on the 4th December along with the Foundation Licence Manual
