General Business:


Darren VK3HEN has dumped some video files and photos of the BBQ on a USB stick for download into Toby's Laptop.

Feedline & Feedpoint Protection-Yagi Antennas Contributed by Hilton Younger



In an attempt to lessen the damage caused by Corellas I have covered the feedpoint with a guard made from thermoset plastic. This is simply a piece of UV proof stormwater pipe tested in the microwave oven for suitability before heating with a heatgun and molding into shape



The first two metres of feedline is also protected by being inserted into twelve millimetre water hose. This is the 2 metre yagi.



The UHF antenna was subjected to the same treatment.
