Show n Tell

Bill Crocker brought along an old Collins receiver from WW 2. He is in the process of restoring. The tuning of the Radio is carried out by a mechanical procedure. One section of the three involved in the tuning took Bill about 6 hours to dismantle and rebuild cleaning up all the dust and corrosion on the way through. If you looked at the component that Bill was working on you could easily see how you could spend six hours cleaning and rebuilding it. We must also remember that Bill is working without any manuals or instructions as to how the mechanics of the movement should operate.



These pictures give some idea of the complexity of the unit. The unit is a 105A/ARR-15 receiver. It was designed for use as an auto tune unit in combination with the autotune ART-13 transmitter. The receiver can be manually tuned if you lock the autotune mechanism and you can also manually tune the transmitter in a similar manner.

If anybody has more information on this unit Bill would be only too pleased to hear from you.


