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From the Editor

As I and a few others use IRLP on a regular basis I thought I would inform others as to how the system works. A number of members have made comments that they are not sure how to use it and are interested to become au fait with the procedures.

IRLP usually operates on 2m or 70cm. It is method of communicating long distance via a Computer, a Radio and using the local repeater. By long distance I mean anywhere in the World where there is an IRLP Node. A special Microphone is required that can generate the DTMF tones. Each IRLP Node or location has a 4 digit number. This list of Node numbers can be found at the IRLP web site. The address for this web site is www.irlp.net. The site carries lots of other information about IRLP that is far greater in depth than this little editorial.

To operate IRLP you listen to check that the local repeater frequency is not in use. If it is clear you then announce your call sign and that you wish to use the IRLP. After releasing the PTT you then press the PTT again and key in the number of the IRLP Node you wish to contact. After keying in the number release the PTT and listen. If you have been connected successfully to the Node you dialled the Node will respond with a connection message.

After connection it is normal to wait about 10 seconds prior to putting out a call. Effectively you are connected to a repeater that you normally can't hear so you need to make sure you have not interrupted local traffic. It IS acceptable to call CQ, in fact, if you really want to make a contact, it is preferable to say "This is VK3FPSR calling CQ, is anyone available for a contact?" as opposed to "VK3FPSR Listening" ...silence for 2 minutes, followed by a disconnect. However 3 x 3 x 47 CQs are unnecessary and should be left for CW/SSB frequencies where tuning around is the observed practice.

Once your connection is made and you have a contact you carry out a normal conversation. I find it is better if you leave a pause between overs for the system to catch up or in case someone else wishes to join your conversation.

At the conclusion of your conversation you need to disconnect from the Node you are connected to. Simply announce that you are going clear of the Node and key 73 into your Microphone keypad. This will disconnect you. The Node that you had been connected to will now announce that you have been disconnected.

In next months Newsletter I will give more information on using IRLP. This is only the start and will get you up and running initially.

Previous Minutes past: Ed (VK3BG) moved that the last minutes be passed and John (VK3PXJ) seconds this. **Correspondence:**

Inwards: Received receipt for the clubrooms rent and handed to the treasurer. Received a BARG newsletter to show around the clubrooms. Rent for the P.O.BOX has arrived and passed on to the treasurer. Received an e-mail from Ted Thrift as to the e-mail he received for the change of office bearers.

Outwards: Ed (VK3BG) sent a e-mail to the Wagga Wagga Amateur club and the Albury Amateur club as to a joint BBQ. There have been no replies from either club. They have probably not had their meetings as yet to decide. The Secretary (VK3DAG) sent a letter to Geoffrey Angus (VK3ZNA) thanking him for his part in time and equipment towards the six meter repeater project.

Treasures Report:

Ron VK3COP handed out the treasurer's report for all members present. A motion was raised by Ron (VK3COP) as to the treasurer report and seconded by Toby (VK3PNF).

General Reports:

Rodney (VK3UG) report on the six meter repeater: Most of the six meter repeater work was done at Ray Wales (VK3RW) location. Then it went to Daryl (VK3KL) location for a trial period but not many people could access the repeater at this location. Then a motion was passed at the last meeting to trial the repeater at Geoffrey Angus (VK3ZNA) location. The repeater has now been taken to Geoff's location. And hopefully be operating at the end of the second week in March. Not forgetting that Geoff has a business to run. This repeater will have audible tone assist access of either 91.5 or 123 Hz. Depending on what it's set to. We listen on 53.725 MHz and transmit on 52.725 MHz. This is a 1 MHz negative offset. Rodney (VK3UG) and ED (VK3BG) will go up to the repeater site to prepare the repeater hut for the six meter cavities in the near future.

Toby report on WIA broadcast: Toby (VK3PNF) has been relaying the WIA Broadcast from his location on Sunday nights at 7:30 PM to the (VK3RGV) repeater site. This involves playing the WIA audio with the repeater timeouts disabled. Toby is currently setting up an automatic system with help from Michael Alsop (VK8MA). Michael is compiling a software list to accomplish this in some spare time. This could be run from any location that has good signal access into the repeater site. Ed (VK3BG) mentioned that the Club might have a working 828 crystal locked radio for this purpose. Also an Internet connection is needed each week to down load the WIA broadcast audio file.

Club lunch on Sunday: The annual club lunch in December will be held on the first Sunday in December. The venue does not have to be the same as last year. And neither does it have to be Asian food. Ed (VK3BG) and Ron (VK3COP) are going to check various venues out to suggest to the members at the next

meeting.

Committee for Ham fest: A brief mention of committee members for the coming Hamfest was spoken about and Ed (VK3BG) is calling for any interested members. John (VK3PXJ), I (VK3DAG), Ron (VK3COP) and Ed (VK3BG) are on the list. Anyone else who wants to be on the list is welcome to nominate. Basically follow the formats of last year.

General Business:

Rodney wants a fold over tower: Rodney (VK3UG) is suggesting that we start looking into a fold over tower for the repeater site on top of Mt Wombat as we are not getting any younger to be climbing towers. This is to enable the service of antennas on the main tower without the need for a rigger. Some real investigation is needed on how to accomplish this. Let's get our heads together to solve it.

Working Bee at the Club rooms: It was suggested that we have a working bee at the Club rooms before the next meeting. This is to clean out the unused rubbish that we have accumulated over the previous years. And give Ian (VK3CHV) a chance to organise the S.A.D.A.R.C. station. Also a BBQ will be held to save the worry of lunch. The working bee will start at 10AM first Saturday of next month.

Ed getting club shirt: Ed (VK3BG) has got a sample club shirt made up from the same place that the caps are made. These would be good to wear on comms days, club outings etc. He is taking orders for anyone interested in purchasing a shirt. The shirt is in club colours with "Shepparton and District Amateur Radio Club" printed across the front top side.

Thank Daryl for sign: The S.A.D.A.R.C. sign that Daryl (VK3KL) made for the club was displayed at the club meeting. Members commented on the sign professionalism. And appreciation in the time and cost that Daryl put into it. A motion was moved by John (VK3FJHM) and second by Pat (VK3OV) for a letter of thanks. And a letter of thanks will be sent to Daryl for his contribution.

Nally Tower: I (VK3DAG) can e-mail out the VCAT court file titled "Maciszewski v Casey CC [2003] VCAT 402 (10 April 2003)" to anyone interested. It's possible that you don't need a permit to put a Nally tower on your residential land. This goes for Nally tower design only. This is because Amateur radio is a hobby pursued at home.
