Check the Face to see if it is drooping, lift the Arms to see if they can hold them up, check the Speech to make sure it is not slurred and if you are concerned about any of these, Time is the most critical thing in treatment of a stroke. Thank you Bert for your time and effort.

A special welcome to two new members. Matt Holloway who will be sitting for his Foundation Licence soon and Allan Burgess VK3ON. Both gentleman paid there subs at the June meeting which leads me to remind everybody that subs are due now for the next year. Mount Wombat Technical Report June 2012 (24/6/2012)

The situation with all repeaters is that they are performing well, and we want it to stay that way as it is very cold at the moment and a trip to the mountain isn't a welcome thought. The queries re the **D-Star** costs for internet connection remain unresolved and Ray is still waiting on the **APRS** modem.

This does not mean that nothing is going on as Philip is beavering away on upgrades for the 6 metre repeater. Phil has built an improved front end for the receiver which he has tested with Ray. The tests have ascertained that the new front end is unlikely to be overloaded by the small amount of transmitter energy getting through the receiver cavities. The 50 watt module has arrived for the transmitter and this will be worked on soon.

Into the spring and early summer we will be looking at having one or two working bees on site. There are a number of projects to be worked on and members may have ideas how some of these projects can be effectively done. The technical committee isn't the font of all knowledge. Members may have ideas on other things that may be desirable to do up on the mountain and what they can help with.


- The removal of the central antenna mast on the hut (getting rusty and possibly unsafe). Bill Crocker has indicated he can assist with advice on the best methods to do this.
- Shifting of the UHF CB repeater antenna onto a hut mast.
- Installing the heavy duty 70 cm repeater antenna onto a hut mast and commissioning it. (Antenna currently at VK3UG's)
- Fitting the remaining two hut masts (currently stored at Steve's).
- Checking all the lattice mast cables and connections some are to be shortened.
- Install and trial the upgraded 6 metre repeater.

- We are also looking at increasing the gain of the 6 metre antenna by 3 dB, but whether it is a project that will get legs this year is unknown at this stage. Costs come into this.
- General tidy up around the site.
- Check the batteries.
