TECHNICAL COMMITTEE REPORT – OCTOBER 2013

The D-Star repeater is still out of action. Toby had picked it up from Greg to test it before going back on the hill a few weeks ago. This had been repaired at Icom but when Toby tested it, it now had full power but still could not communicate with any D-Star radios. The D-Star specialist at Icom Australia, who had worked on it was out of the country for a few weeks, so at this stage they could not help us.

The bullet proof backup power supply for the repeaters has been completed by Rodney. It has been tested and all safety features are operating. It is currently stored at Phils' (VK3ELV) if required as Rodney has gone north on holidays.

Plans are going ahead for the installation of the new 6 metre antenna. The ex-pager 2 metre backup antenna will possibly be moved to one of the hut masts and an insulator will have to be installed on the top guy that runs near the new 6 metre antenna installation. If anyone has a suitable insulator available , it would be much appreciated.
