Technical Committee Annual Report, Oct 2012- Oct-2013

The first job for the year was the removal the centre hut mast as it was ageing and had to make room for the new corner hut masts. This was done on the 16th of December by a committed crew, braving some not so nice weather. The DC supply to the UHF CB Repeater was repaired on this day, as it had been out of action for a couple of weeks. The UHF CB antenna was moved to one of the new hut masts to join the 6 metre back up antenna and the X50 diamond used for 70cm, which were previously installed on one of the other hut masts. The two remaining hut masts were also installed.

On the 2nd of January the new 6 metre repeater was trialled but it was found that the TX cavities could not handle the higher power. The original repeater was reinstalled until the cavity issues could be resolved.

An electrical storm passed through the area on the 14th of February (Happy Valentines' Day) and took out our main power supply and did some other damage. This left only the 2 metre repeater and UHF CB repeater on air using the backup battery supply. Toby and Rob were planning to go Mount Wombat to retrieve the Dstar Repeater for repair on the 16/2 but ended up doing quite a bit more than anticipated. The 2 metre repeater was put back on air with its' internal power supply but all other equipment was out of action. The damaged power supply was brought back to Shepparton. A new replacement unit was going to cost around \$1500 and we had no spare. Rodney inspected the power supply at home and discovered that the faults were on a surface mount board that he could not service. Luckily for us, Denys VK3ZYZ was equipped and experienced with this type of work, and repaired it for us, at no cost to the club.

The repaired power supply, surge protector, and a stepdown transformer were installed on the 6th of March. This put the 6 metre, 70cm, and UHF CB repeaters back on air and enabled battery charging for the backup supply. This showed us just how vulnerable we were and plans were made for a backup power supply.

In April the new stacked dipole array for the 70cm repeater was installed on one of the hut masts. This leaves the X50 diamond dual band antenna as back up for either 2 metres or 70cms.

In May the new 50 watt 6 metre repeater was installed with the refurbished TX and RX cavities.

In August Rodney completed and tested the "bullet proof" backup power supply.

The Dstar repeater has been out of service all year and at this stage Icom is seeking help from Japan.

The next project to get off the ground is the installation of new 6 metre antenna, purchased by the club earlier in the year.

There have been quite a number of other smaller jobs done by the technical committee throughout the year and there have also been quite a number of other members who have helped. Many thanks to all those that have helped maintain and make improvements to the club equipment.
