As you can see some of the topics are quiet technical in their content but as an F call I still gained a lot from the weekend. Not all the lectures were at a level that was too technical. One of the most enjoyable lectures that would apply to all amateurs was presented by Richard Gipps VK3ZCL on Band stop filters with P-Syn.

P-Syn can be found at http://www.gipps.id.au/ and go to the menu item for P-Syn. P-Syn has a schematic display which allows component values to be changed and the circuit responses are automatically updated.

You will also see that one of our members Geoff Angus donated to the Geelong Amateur Radio Club some 3.5GHz subscriber transceivers.



These are suitable for conversion to 3.4GHz transverters. The converted units will work with a low power 70cm radio. The conversion will take about 8 hours to complete.

Three complete transceivers are required to make two transverters. This is because parts must be recovered from one unit to complete the conversion of the other two. While this may seem a little wasteful, the resourceful ham will no doubt be able to use some of the remaining parts from the third unit in other projects. It is recommended that two people get together and modify two panels sharing a third panel to complete the conversions.

Transceivers are available from the Geelong Amateur Radio club in lots of three at a cost of \$50 (Buy two, get one free) This information was

taken from the GARC Website and I wish to acknowledge them for that. More information on this project can be found at <u>Www.vk3atl.org</u> including documentation on how to carry out the project.

The worst part of the weekend was the weather, it was cold and wet most of the time, didn't worry me too much but messed it up for the ladies. Will I attend next year – definitely yes.

Inward mail account from Scout committee for rent for hall, moved Kevin vk3bhp that the account be paid seconded byHuntley vk3ze.


Financial report presented by Ron vk3cop ,moved by Ron that it be accepted, seconded by Allan vk3ao
