Peter Rentsch who goes to other hamfests as both an interested amateur and as a commercial entity finds that the way we lay out tables, our charges and generally run our hamfests are okay but that we could also look at the ways other groups run theirs and learn from what works well for them and adopt some of their ideas. Ron made the point that we need to have more people on the day to run the hamfest so that no one member is overloaded with things to do. Relief is needed so that toilet and cuppa breaks can be easily achieved. People need to be put on a roster so the work load is spread. The Murray Quad is to be held on the Sunday of the March Labour Day long weekend, 13th of March 2016 on and around Australia's famous Murray River which is home to one of the world's oldest and longest kayak race, the Murray Marathon. The Murray Quad, as a unique event that consisting of 4 legs (Swim, Run, Cycle and Paddle) and based on the World Quadrathlon distances, it is the only one of its kind in Australia and is supported and encouraged by the World Quadrathlon Federation.

Starting with the 3.2 km Swim in Yarrawonga on Lake Mulwala, the Murray Quad will test competitors by following up the swim with a 21.1 km Half Marathon run locally in Yarrawonga then heads out of town on the bike for 91.5 kms before arriving in Cobram where they will hit the water, finishing the gruelling event with a 25 km paddle down the mighty Murray River to arrive at Tocumwal completing a total of 141kms of physical endurance.

To support the participants in the Murray Quad through the course there will be a number Emergence Access Points (EAP) that will relying information on the progress of the participants to the race director and advise the event safety officer of any emergency that has occurred on the course and assist the medical service teams if required.

Location of Communications located around the event, this may include Radios and mobile phones.

Between the start and the finish of the race there will be 13 on land communication check points and an additional communication on safety boats located on the water for the swim and paddle leg. If there is an incident during the event the team located at these check points will be responsible for relying information back to central control (CC) that is located at the Yarrawonga rowing club.
