

PCB Design for a new Membership Card-More than just Cardboard

At our last meeting, Josh Gardiner presented to the club a great idea to create a membership card using a printed circuit board.

Josh has been busy working on this project, so I will hand over to Josh for the details.

Hi all, Josh here,

This year I had an idea that came to me during the Hack a Day's PCB business card contest, The idea being since pcb's are so cheap why don't we have an interesting PCB membership card? So, my hunt began for something

interesting that could fit onto the back of a membership card.

A few months ago, I did a run of 0.8mm PCB's as card art to see if they were ok for a wallet. They were a hit. The downside was I still did not have a good idea of what useful thing I should put on the reverse side.

Then a couple of weeks ago Denys posted a link to a breadboard SDR based on the Raspberry Pi PICO on the forums.

http://www.sadarc.org/xenforo/upload/index.php?threads/pi-pico-sdr.598/ Now this could be it; I still need to do a bit of work to make it all happen smoothly including ordering a prototype,

It looks very promising.

The idea is to have the front face of the PCB to serve the function of being our membership card with all the details of previous years. The back will be a simple standalone SDR project, for anyone wishing to build it. It is also possible that the majority of the "component sand" all the small SMD passives could be populated on a special run of PCB's to make it easy to start the project. However, the idea is to order enough PCB's that everyone gets one as part of their membership and if they want an extra one to just build as a project while keeping their original card unsoldered, so they can keep it in their wallet that will be possible.

To give credit this is not my circuit or even my pcb. All I have done so far is to make small changes to layout of the pcb and the silkscreen to include my preferred symbols and to use component values rather than designator for the components as that is much more kind to people. I also use different shaped pads for quick identification. I also plan to change the majority of the remaining through hole components to be surface mount as this will make the front cleaner for the SADARC and Jaycar logo, add a battery mount and a lipo charger.

The vast majority of the work which follows is from the original open source project by Jonathan Dawson.


