

438.9MHz (-7 MHz - DMR), In Service 439.775MHz (-5 MHz), Now back in service, IRLP (node #6990)

476.475 MHz (+750 kHz) CB Repeater WBT03 Channels 3- 33, In Service VK3RDS, 438.7625 MHz (-7 MHz DMR) Shepparton on test @ VK3YNV QTH

- 1. A new guest attended today, welcome Peter.
- 2. President Graeme VK3VSM opened the meeting with information that Rob VK3BLD resigned as the Secretary due to ill health. We all wish to thank Rob for all his work on the Committee and wish him well going forward. Adam 3UU to step in to fill the shoes of Rob.

#### 3. Correspondence (inwards).

We were notified about our inquiry on the property at 4A Packham street. Tina responded to us that we were declined the space due to size and traffic impacts. There is still potential for being a sub tenant however this is not by any means certain.

Outwards. Letter to our current site re occupying the Mens Shed property.

- 5. Technical Report. Ray reported there is communications with the (Telstra) Installation guys re additional tower work. This includes some required assistance for Geoff's tower.

AllStar Node. Work to the CM108 board is ongoing. Ray indicated that other CM108 controller boards are available for others to use on AllStar please see Ray if you want one.

The current audio issues will delay the on air status until next month for DMR.

Acceptance of the Technical Report proposed Ray 3YNV, seconded Geoff 3GSR.

6. General Business.

SDR Project. Now the tower is up at Bill's site things are moving forward. However, the SDR project has an internal noise problem still being worked on. Additionally, a new counterpoise is to be added to the system. We also received a donated Solar Panel from Paul Watters, many thanks to Paul.

SADARC HamFest. Peter VK3AXI lead the discussion to set the date of the HamFest for the second Sunday in September (14<sup>th</sup>). There is investigation about an alternate site for the event however time is running tight. A suggested site is the Kialla Central Hall. Graeme will visit to see if the site is appropriate. In the meantime, booking of St Augustines will be made to secure a site with potential for Kialla as an upside.

#### **Investment Account**

After investigation our best opportunity at Bendigo Bank is 3.25%. It was decided to place approximately 60% of our funds, into this term deposit. Proposed Ray seconded Ian 3YYY carried unanimously.

Ray Wales VK3RW requested a badge and Jaycar card.

CB Repeater. The upcoming ACMA "Have your Say, into the operational characteristics of the Citizens Band Radio Service" is open. A discussion around issues we saw in behaviour and use of the repeater was had. It was decided that a response on behalf of SADARC would be submitted for this inquiry.
