

ACMA Update

ACMA remakes Amateur Licence Conditions Determination

In April 2025, we consulted on our proposal to remake the Radiocommunications Licence Conditions (Amateur Licence) Determination 2015.

We have now made the <u>Radiocommunications Licence Conditions (Amateur Licence) Determination 2025</u>, which will commence on 30 September 2025.

CB Radio Changes, as reported by the ACMA

Several months ago, the **ACMA called for public submissions** on proposed updates to the **Citizens Band (CB) Radio Class Licence**. After reviewing 60 submissions, they've now released the final changes.

FM on HF CB (26–27 MHz): Now legal, aligning Australia with Europe/US. Clearer local comms, less noise.

Internet Linking Allowed: VoIP/Radio-over-IP links between CB stations are legal (CB ↔ CB only, not to ham or other services).

Emergency Channels Kept: HF Ch 9, UHF Ch 5 & 35 remain reserved for emergencies. Wording updated to also allow training/coordination use.

Call Channel Rule Removed: No need to start contacts on Ch 11 (HF/UHF). Any channel can be used.

Inspector Consent Clause Removed: No more special permission for modified radios—illegal if causing interference, full stop.

On-Air Behaviour Rule Removed: ACMA won't police harassment/offensive language. Now falls under criminal law (police matter).

Identification Bursts: Short digital ID bursts (≤400 ms) now permitted.

Directions & Enforcement Clarified: Officials can still order you off-air, but you now have the right to appeal via merits review.

Telecom Network Provision Removed: Old rules about CBs connecting to the phone network scrapped (obsolete).

Alpine Rally of East Gippsland

Saturday 29th and Sunday 30th November 2025

We need radio operators to volunteer for the Alpine Rally.

The Alpine is the oldest surviving motorsport event in Australia and the second oldest rally in the world!

It will be based in Lakes Entrance with stages being held in the Bruthen, Nowa Nowa and Orbost areas.
