### **Equipment:**

Icom Australia have kindly lent us some transceivers for the event. An IC-7610, IC-7300 and a IC-5100 (for local 2m repeater access). You are welcome to use the Icom transceivers or bring your own. Power Amplifiers have kindly been provided by a couple of participants but may not be available the whole weekend.

A second IC-7300 has also been kindly lent to us by a participant. Windows based computers will be provided with internet connections running the N1MM Logger+ software for those that want to use it. Pens and Logging sheets are also provided for those who wish it.

There are three stations setup each with a selection of 3 switched antennas. Some care has been taken to get a good selection of antennas for each station. If you require another selection please negotiate with staff and other participants. Great circle maps and sweeps have been prepared for each of the antenna and will be provided at the operating station(keep the antenna maps with antenna). Some antennas can be slewed(electronic beam direction change), those that can be are indicated as multiple radials on the great circle map, please ask BAI staff to help if you would like the antenna to be redirected.

12VDC power supplies are supplied, along with a pair deep cycle batteries. 240VAC is also available for your equipment if you wish, but please bring power boards/extension cables.

No keys or headphones are provided. Each of the stations are separated enough for reasonable audio isolation from each other.

#### SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCE SITE VISITOR BRIEFING FOR RADIO AUSTRALIA

#### All Visitors are to be fully escorted by a Broadcast Australia staff member while on site. Do-Not wander off.

Your personal safety, the protection of Broadcast Australia equipment and the environment, requires your conformity to the BAI Communications site access procedures and relevant WHS requirements.

RF Radiation – During the event Non-Ionising radiation may be present at the antennas. Access to these areas are restricted to authorised personnel only. There are no radiation hazards within the building compound.

Accident Reporting - Any accident, or near miss, must be reported to the BAI Communications representative whether an injury occurred or not. If an injury does occur, a First Aid kit is available at the rear door entrance. In an emergency Police, Fire, Ambulance can be contacted on 000

Emergency Power Plant – This equipment is housed adjacent to the carport area, is remotely controlled and can start at any time. This area is not to be entered if plant is running. If in this area when a mains failure occurs, protect ears with hands and leave the noise area as soon as practical.

Touching or Operating Site Equipment - No site equipment is to be operated or changed in any way. Take care when walking around the site not to lean against anything or to change the operation of anything.

Social Media - Any photos taken are for personal use only and are not to be published on social media or used in any way commercial without prior approval of BAI Communications.

Fire Emergency - In the event of an emergency, an alarm bell will sound both inside and outside the main building. Upon hearing the alarm, please walk quickly to your nearest exit if within the building and proceed to the assembly area situated at the main gates at the front of the main building and await further instructions.

Dust or Smoke - Excess of dust or smoke inside and certain areas outside the main building can cause alarms. Smoking is therefore prohibited within the confines of all buildings.


Vehicle Movement – During the event there will be numerous vehicle movements taking place in the driveway and car parking areas. Be mindful of this when walking outdoors.


Facilities – The Toilets and Kitchen are available for use during the event. Please clean up after yourself.
